This advanced workshop will inspect the changes that have occurred in soft science (interpretive/qualitative) approaches in the last two decades or so, and will gauge the fit of these cutting edge thoughtlines for Tourism Studies (particularly in international and postcolonial settings) and to the related domains of Public Culture, Public Nature and Public Heritage. This workshop is designed for informed Masters and PhD students with a disciplinary interest in the social, cultural, political, and psychic importances of tourism.

Professor Keith Hollinshead is an analyst and commentator of the ways in which populations, institutions and interest groups variously imagine the world and how 'space' and 'place' is constructed within particular cultural and cosmological 'imaginings'. He has a particular regard for matters of agency and authority in how the world's longtime inheritances – and different / 'other' peoples – are (or are not) valued. Professor Hollinshead serves as Critical Reviews Editor of *Tourism Analysis and Tourism, Culture and Communication*, and serves on eight boards of international peer review journals.
