INTRODUCTION

The Department of Tourism Research Handbook (1989-2009) has been compiled to mark the twentieth anniversary of the department. Established in 1989 initially as a Centre for Tourism Research, the department has always maintained a principal focus on providing timely research to serve the academic community, as well as the diversity of wider government and tourism industry stakeholders. All academic staff in the department have active research programmes, many involving long standing international collaborations addressing a wide range of interests in tourism and related areas. Research and supervision are integral to the department's work and significant time is spent on research activities. The department hosts an annual publications launch in early March to coincide with the beginning of the academic year and the arrival and induction of new graduate students.

Each year staff and graduate students attend and present work at a range of national and international conferences. Many conference contributions, including the delivery of keynote addresses, are invited and members of the department's academic staff are actively involved in the organization and delivery of conference sessions of interest at domestic and international conferences. The research culture of the department is reflected in the results of the Tertiary Education Commission's (TEC) 2004 and 2006 performance-based research funding (PBRF) research evaluation exercises, which indentified the Department of Tourism as the first ranked academic department in New Zealand providing research in the field of tourism and related areas.

The research strengths of the department have evolved considerably over two decades, as reflected by the changing profile of the academic staff of the department over time. From the outset and through the 1990s, the prominence of the department's research was built upon the Sustainable Tourism research programme, which attracted significant government funding from the Foundation for Research, Science and Technology (FRST). This programme of research created numerous funded research positions that helped to launch the careers of many young scholars who have progressed into the academic ranks of the University of Otago and various other national and international institutions. While a principal focus on nature-based tourism generally, including tourism development in rural, peripheral and wilderness contexts, has continued to be a strength of the department, the research of the department has diversified considerably in the second decade following a series of successful academic appointments from the late-1990s.

By the middle of this decade the department had developed research expertise and scholarship in four major strategic areas; events and conventions, entrepreneurship and SMEs, representation and identity and nature-based tourism in its widest sense. These inter-related areas reflected not only staff interests and the thrust of the department's teaching programmes, but also the department's continuing efforts to provide research that is both theoretically informed and timely to meet the needs of the local/regional, New Zealand and international tourism communities.

In recent years the research profile of the department has continued to evolve and diversify. The academic staff of the department, working individually, in various local, national and international collaborations, and with graduate research students, are now advancing research of international significance in fields as diverse as:

- Human mobility (e.g., migration, second homes, diaspora, transnational networks and the social science field of mobility).
- Sustainable cultural tourism (e.g., host-guest interaction, tourism representations and identity, community-based tourism, gender and tourism)
- Travel experiences of young budget travelers (e.g., backpacker tourism)
- Regional planning and sustainable development (e.g., strategic planning for regional tourism destinations, tourism networks and clusters, and regional development)
- Tourism entrepreneurship (e.g., tourism SMEs)
- Hospitality (e.g., HRM, cultural aspects of the hospitality experience)
- Wine and food tourism (e.g., wine marketing and consumer behaviour, gastronomic/culinary tourism)
- Air transport management (e.g., aeropolitics and regulatory structures)
- Sustainable nature-based tourism (e.g. Ecotourism, Adventure, tourism and conservation)
- The relationship between tourism and the non-human world (e.g., species conservation, wildlife habituation, hunting and fishing)

- Sport and tourism development (e.g., sport and place, sport and tourism environments)
- Leisure and tourism behaviour (e.g., the role of leisure in personal identity formation)

These research directions have been pursued in association with a range of other developments. The department now has well established programmes of research and collaboration, some now longstanding, in New Zealand, Turkey, Norway, France, Scotland and Canada, among other countries. Simultaneously the growing international profile of the department's academic ranks and graduate programmes have given rise to research initiatives and interests of growing prominence in the Asia-Pacific region, South Pacific, South Asia, Europe and Africa. The creation of the Centre for Recreation Research (<http://www.crr.otago.ac.nz/>) in 2008 has continued to build the department's reputation for timely research that integrates tourism theory and practice, and addresses business and economic development issues in a way that gives high priority to the sustainability of natural and socio-cultural environments.

The department continually works to maintain and further build the close relationship between the academic interests of staff and the research activities of graduate students. Graduate students are encouraged to develop their academic skills beyond the production of a dissertation or thesis. All research students are encouraged to develop relationships with key industry and government stakeholders, publish the results of their work and to report findings to domestic and international audiences. The Department has developed a strong reputation for graduate research supervision and currently boasts one of the largest doctoral research programmes in tourism in the world. It is noteworthy that many of the research and publication achievements outlined in this document, including many peer reviewed publications in high ranking international journals, have been achieved through the co-authorship efforts of graduate students (this handbook does not include the numerous sole authored publications of graduate students). Such publication successes speak volumes of the quality of research being performed by graduate students, who are in many cases attracted to the Department specifically by the established research programmes of the academic staff who supervise them. These successes should be viewed in association with the anniversary Graduate Research Handbook (1989-2009) (www.otago.ac.nz/tourism), which documents the dissertations and theses produced by the department's graduate students over the last two decades.

In marking this twentieth anniversary milestone it is important to acknowledge the significant contributions of several key individuals. The initial discussion of post-graduate qualifications in Tourism in the late-1980s involved Professors Guenther Muller-Heumann (Department of Marketing), John Omer-Cooper (Department of History) and Peter Holland (Department of Geography). The vision that Tourism research and teaching at the University of Otago cross departments and academic Divisions is a reflection of the diverse academic backgrounds of those that engaged in these initial discussions, and their support for the development of a Tourism programme.

The subsequent success of the Tourism programme is, to a great extent, a tribute to the drive and vision of its Directors. Initially, it was Professor Geoff Kearsley (Director, Centre for Tourism, 1989-1999) who established the Centre for Tourism, building its research reputation with a series of FRST (Sustainable tourism) external research grants, and driving the move towards departmental status with the successful development of undergraduate courses – including the Bachelor of Tourism (now Bachelor of Commerce majoring in Tourism) – and the necessary appointment of staff. Subsequently that drive and vision was provided by Professor Michael Hall (Head of Department, 1999-2006), who directed the transition to Departmental Status in 2000 and then created and implemented the structures, policies and procedures required of an academic unit that was geared towards success. Through attracting internationally and appointing to the academic ranks of the Department a number of young scholars, and particularly through his own prolific research and publication efforts, the Department's international profile became firmly established. Their efforts have provided a platform for further success in the decades ahead.
